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Professional Development

Dr. Jack Butterfield, Medical Director presented education on COVID-19 including a vaccine update.

In September, Muskingum County wa ranked 5th in comparison to other counties in Ohio for the highest occurrence of COVID-19 cases.

ZMCHD Incident Command

In June, our COVID-19 numbers showed that we were moving into a more endemic phase of this disease. Our emergency response ramped down and we demobilized our mass immunization site at the Fairgrounds.

COVID-19 cases started to rise again in July. By the end of July we more than doubled the number of cases we saw in June. The Delta variant presented in our community. We had concerns about the return to school and more and more indoor activities this fall. We worked hard to help our community prepare.

In August, due to substantial COVID-19 community spread, the CDC strongly recommended masks for everyone in indoor settings and crowded areas. ZMCHD required masks indoors on August 4th. On August 9th, ZMCHD issued a mask advisory for Muskingum County.

By mid-August we were experiencing another surge in COVID cases locally. Just in time for the Muskingum County Fair and Return to School. This surge, attributed to the Delta variant, was much worse than what we experienced last fall and winter. This variant is much more infectious and has impacted younger people at this time. We continued to encourage vaccination as the best protection against COVID.

Since there were no state mandates this year, and seemingly no interest or political will to issue local mandates, we continued to issue advisories with the very best science-based prevention protocols to urge our community to take action to stop the spread of COVID-19.

COVID-19 cases continued to climb the first 3 weeks of September and we were busier than our busiest time last fall/winter. Finally, in the last week of the month we saw numbers decrease slightly. We worked closely with the hospital to push out messaging alerting the community to the fast spread of the Delta variant and the disconcerting hospitalization numbers.

Muskingum County COVID-19 Unified Command



On June 2, 2021, our COVID numbers were so low the Unified Command demobilized. The drop in cases was due to effective mitigation efforts (masking and distancing) by our community businesses and workplaces, outdoor activities effectively increasing natural distancing, and vaccinations.

By the end of July, cases surged.

On August 10, Unified Command presented a COVID-19 Update for the

first time since June 2nd due to the resurgence of COVID-19.

On August 25, the Unified Command group began to meet again this time on Wednesdays in response to the pandemic.

In September, safety messages were issued to inform the public the variant was outpacing the surge from last fall the record number of patients seen by Genesis Healthcare System, and COVID-19 deaths increasing again.

COVID -19 Vaccination

June brought a downward trend in our vaccination numbers to 233 from 530 doses given in May.

Vaccination numbers continued to decrease in July with only 132 doses given. We promoted COVID-19 vaccine along with back to school vaccines for 12-year-olds and up.

In August, we gave 192 vaccinations. We dispelled COVID-19 vaccine myths and promoted a long list of vaccine providers in Muskingum County. In mid-August the CDC approved a third dose of Pfizer for people who are immunocompromised.

The demand for vaccinations started to increase in September. We administered 269 doses of vaccine. Late September, the CDC approved a booster dose of Pfizer for certain populations. Our total doses administered June-September reached 826.



At-Home COVID-19 Test Kits

We continue to partner with the Muskingum County Library System to make Abbot Binax NOW Rapid COVID-19 tests available at all library branches free of charge to community members.

The test kits are to be used in conjunction with a tele-med app.

Access to a smartphone or tablet or a computer with an internet connection is required.

NOTE: The app must be downloaded and used to take the test. We cannot provide quarantine letters if we do not have this documentation through the app. The library has free high-speed wifi available in all outdoor spaces.

Accreditation Update
